Course Aims: To refresh and develop the participant's understanding of relevant aspects of traffic law to help them to use the road in a safe and legal manner

Course Objectives, by the end of the session drivers should be able to:

- Demonstrate that you understand the legal definition of a road
- Recall the national speed limits for different types of roads and vehicles
- Describe the main types of road sign shape and colour and their generic meanings
- Demonstrate that you know the meaning of road signs and markings
- Explain why particular parking scenarios are hazardous and illegal
- Identify different types of pedestrian crossing and the driving rules associated with these
- Understand the principles of the system of vehicle control
- Demonstrate that you can interpret the sections of the driver licence card and paper counterpart
- Explain your legal responsibilities including reporting requirements if involved in a road traffic collision
- Demonstrate you know the law with regard to the use of mobile phones and wearing seat belts while driving
- Understand the term 'corporate manslaughter' and the responsibilities of workers under the corporate manslaughter law
